

# Tukwila Residential Recycling Guidelines

Empty your clean recyclables out of bags and boxes into your blue recycling cart.



## RECYCLING | NEW MATERIALS!

### Clean paper

Newspaper, inserts  
Mail, envelopes  
Cereal and dry food boxes (remove liners)  
Paperback books  
Magazines, catalogs, phone books  
Non-foil wrapping paper  
Frozen food boxes  
Paper cups  
Juice boxes, milk, soy milk and broth containers



### Plastic bottles, jugs, tubs and more

Milk, juice and soda bottles  
Yogurt, dairy and margarine tubs  
Shampoo and conditioner bottles  
Window, bathroom and kitchen cleaner bottles  
Detergent and fabric softener bottles  
Pill bottles (no prescription vials)  
Bagged plastic bags and clean plastic film (e.g. Saran™ wrap)  
Plastic plant pots, 5-gallon buckets.  
*Lids at least 3 inches in diameter can be included loose in recycling*



Ignore the numbers, recycle plastics by shape!

Shredded paper is allowed in recycling if bagged together in clear plastic bag. Shredded paper is also accepted loose in grey compost cart.

Aerosol cans that are not empty should be taken to a hazardous waste drop-off site. See [www.lhwmp.org](http://www.lhwmp.org) or call 888-869-4233 for details.

### Cardboard

Flatten all boxes



### Aluminum and tin cans

Soda cans  
Metal food cans  
Empty, non-toxic aerosol cans.



### Scrap metal and clean foil

Small non-working metal appliances, pots, tools, foil trays, aluminum foil.  
*Limit 2 ft. x 2 ft. x 2 ft., 35 lbs. No wood, plastic, or rubber attachments; no sharp metal.*

### Electronic Waste

(Size limit of 2 feet by 2 feet and less than 60 pounds per unit.)

Schedule e-waste collection by contacting WM's Customer Service Center at 1-800-592-9995. You can also order collection online! After scheduling, residential customers may set out scrap electronics next to their recycling container on their next regularly scheduled recycling collection day. Program includes computer equipment, VCRs, audio equipment, TVs and cell phones.



### Compact Fluorescent (CFL) bulbs

Residents can now safely recycle CFL bulbs at the curb! Residents may request a vapor lock bag by calling WM's Customer Service Center at 1-800-592-9995. You can also order collection online! CFL bags will be mailed upon request. Once the bag is full, residents can set the CFL bag on top of recycling cart on the next regularly scheduled recycling collection day.



### Motor Oil

Residents may place up to three gallons of used motor oil in clear, screw-top jugs next to the recycling cart at the next regularly scheduled collection day.

Residents are required to label all used motor oil with their address. Unlabeled jugs will be left at the curb.



### Used Cooking Oil

Residents may place up to three gallons of used cooking oil in clear, screw-top jugs next to their recycling cart on the next regularly scheduled recycling collection day.

Residents are required to label all used cooking oil with their address. Unlabeled jugs will be left at the curb.
